English Teacher Report By Chris Pigao

Happy New Year! First off, I would like to say thank you to everyone involved at the TSCA Alumni Luncheon last month. I was able to surprise everyone by attending the event and it was wonderful seeing most of you there (including getting a shout-out by Mayor George Chen). Congratulations to Karen Wheeler, our new TSCA President, and all of the wonderful cabinet members (both returning and retiring).

Now, since it's the beginning of our Gregorian Calendar, we often find ourselves wondering "How are we going to start the New Year off ?" For my 3rd year students, their mindset is on a much different track because as we begin our calendar year, they are at the end of their high school careers.

If you are unaware, the Japanese school system starts in April and ends in March. Our 3rd year students at Ichikashi take their final exams at the end of January, leaving the whole month of February to prepare for their future. Some students are busy with university orientations, interviewing for jobs, getting their driver's license, or some even take the time to travel around Japan. Last year, I had one student travel to Okinawa during this transitional period.

This time around, my students that are about to graduate are the ones that I've grown most close to. The graduating 3A class, led by Mami Takeda-Sensei, are the smallest out of all of the class tracks - 14 students total. I remember meeting them when they were 2nd year students, and boy have they changed so much!

My first impression of the class will always stick in my memories. They were just full of this energy that I definitely felt before. I remember thinking, "Oh Geez, this class reminds me of all of the students back in the States" since most of the initial classes I had were shy and polite. From that first moment when I had my self-introduction presentation, to watching them create music videos for an



assignment, seeing them being hosts for the North High Students - these students were able to experience these pivotal events amidst the duration of the pandemic.

All of the laughter, frustrations, and moments of sadness will forever be etched in my memories. Our final class as "student-and-teacher" was on January 24th, where I personally gave my last lecture before the bell rang - echoing the sentiment of a TV show drama. I remember tearing up, saying "I left my friends, my family, my life back home to come teach here. You all made this worthwhile, and I can never thank you enough. MD told me one time that he never saw me as a teacher; he saw me as a friend. I hope you all know that I did the same as well."

To Hinako, Emi, Junpei, Joy, Nozomu, Sechan, Dani, Hisashi, Koyomi, Chenghao, Hiyori, Jenn, MD, and Jave - congratulations on graduating High School. To the rest of the 3rd year students, best of luck in the future! Mark Twain famously once said "Don't let schooling interfere with your education." Just because you're done at Ichikashi, does not mean that your education stops here. You will still be learning way more than you will ever know.

So maybe this might not be the end per se, but a new beginning for their next part of life. Best of luck, friends!
